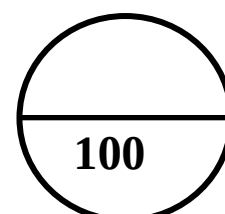

## HOW TO MAKE A TISSUE BOX UKULELE

### YOU WILL NEED:

- an empty box of tissues
- 3-4 rubber bands
- glue and/or cello tape
- an aluminum foil tube
- two ice block sticks
- 2-3 coloured paper (any colour)
- crayons for decoration



### INSTRUCTIONS

1. Cover the tissue box and the foil tube with coloured paper using glue or cello tape (Make sure not to cover the hole in the tissue box.)
2. Cut a hole the size of your foil tube on one end of the tissue box. Put about 2 cm of the tube inside the tissue box. Use cello tape to keep it in place..
3. Pull the rubber bands over the long side of the tissue box with the hole side up.
4. Slide the ice block sticks under the rubber bands on each side of the hole and secure with glue.
5. Decorate your ukulele with crayons and you're ready to rock!

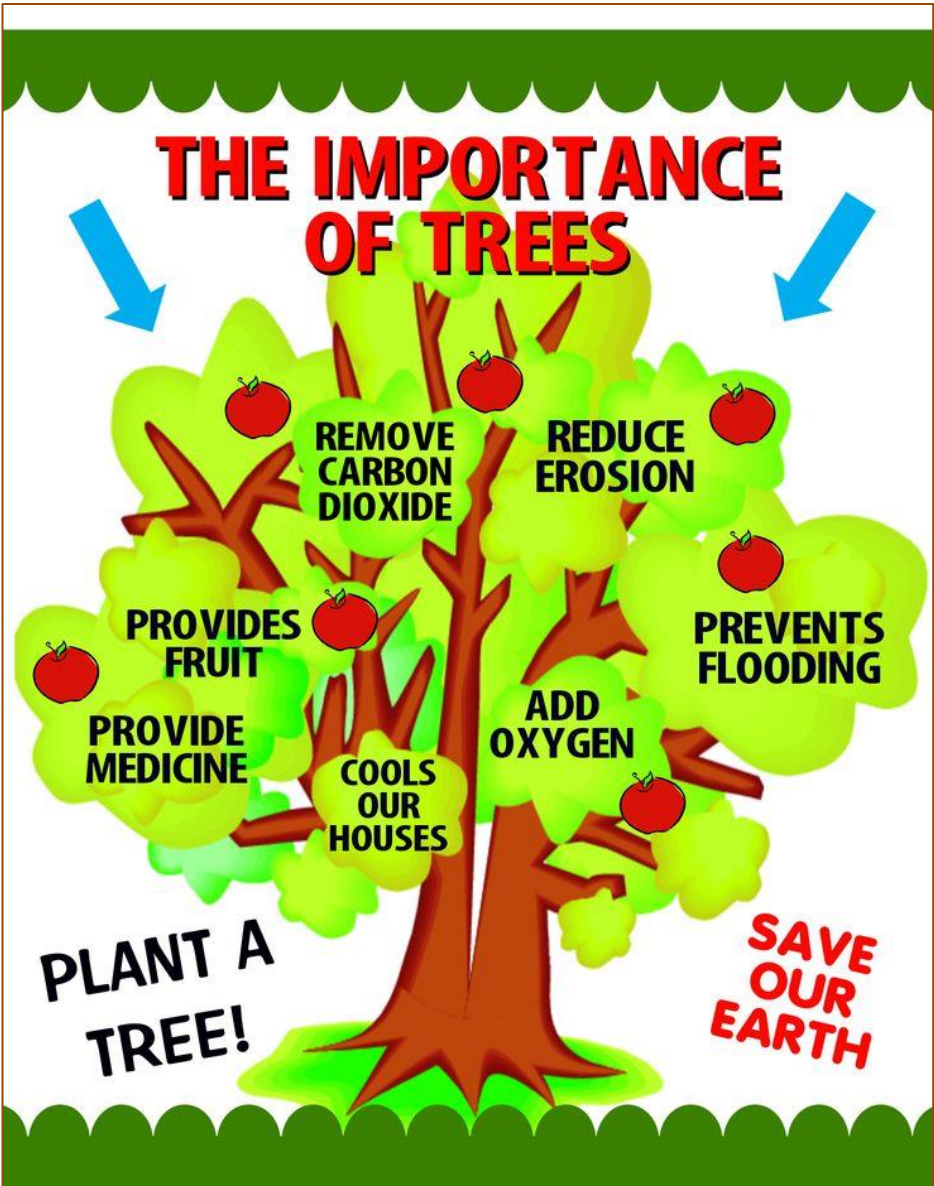
